

Wisconsin ARES/RACES Standard Operating Guideline

SOG 101 Leadership Appointments and Functions

1	101. Wisconsin ARES/RACES fulfills its missions by operating at two levels:			
2	101.1. <u>Amateur Radio Emergency Service (ARES):</u> ARES is a function of the American			
3	Radio Relay League (ARRL), a private corporation with headquarters in Newington,			
4	Connecticut. The State of Wisconsin is an ARRL Section and is part of the ARRL's			
5	Central Division.			
6	101.1.1. <u>Section Manager:</u> At the section level, ARRL operations are the			
7	responsibility of the Section Manager, a member in good standing in the ARRL,			
8	who is elected biannually by the Wisconsin ARRL membership.			
9	101.1.2. <u>Section Emergency Coordinator</u> : The Section Emergency Coordinator			
10	(SEC) is appointed by the Section Manager. The SEC, a member in good			
11	standing in the ARRL, holds a current FCC amateur radio General Class, or			
12	higher, license and is directly responsible for all ARES activities in Wisconsin.			
13	The SEC may serve the dual role of Wisconsin RACES Chief Radio Officer.			
14	101.1.2.1. <u>Assistant Section Emergency Coordinators</u> (ASECs) are appointed			
15	by the SEC and advise the SEC as directed. ASECs are members in good			
16	standing in the ARRL.			
17	101.1.2.2. Subordinate emergency coordinator positions are appointed by			
18	the SEC and serve at the direction of the SEC.			
19	101.1.3. <u>District Emergency Coordinators:</u> A District Emergency Coordinator			
20	(DEC) is appointed for each of the six Wisconsin ARES/RACES districts. DECs			
21	hold a current FCC amateur radio Technician Class, or higher, license and are			

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1	members in good standing in the ARRL and are responsible to the SEC for all		
2	ARES/RACES activities within his/her district.		
3	101.1.3.1. Assistant District Emergency Coordinators: DECs may appoint		
4	one or more Assistant DECs (ADECs) to assist them in their duties. ADECs		
5	serve at the direction of the DEC.		
6	101.1.4. <u>Emergency Coordinators:</u> An Emergency Coordinator (EC) is appointed		
7	for each of the 72 Wisconsin counties. Additional ECs may be appointed for		
8	tribes, municipalities, other geographic or functional areas as the SEC deems		
9	necessary. ECs hold a current FCC amateur radio Technician Class (General		
10	Class if the EC is also the County RACES RO), or higher, license and are		
11	members in good standing in the ARRL and are responsible to the DEC and SEC		
12	for the ARES/RACES activities in their area of responsibility.		
13	101.1.4.1. <u>Assistant Emergency Coordinators:</u> Each EC may appoint one or		
14	more Assistant ECs (AECs) to assist him/her in their duties. AECs serve at		
15	the direction of the EC.		
16	101.2. <u>Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Service (RACES)</u> : RACES is a function of the		
17	Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), a division of the Department of		
18	Homeland Security (DHS) with headquarters in Washington, DC. At the state level,		
19	Wisconsin Emergency Management (WEM), a division of the Wisconsin Department		
20	of Military Affairs (DMA) is responsible for the RACES function.		
21	101.2.1. WEM is headquartered at the Joint Forces Headquarters building, 2400		
22	Wright Street, Madison, Wisconsin 53707-7865. WEM is managed by an		
23	Administrator, who serves at the direction of the Governor, and is ultimately		
24	responsible for the development of emergency services, civil defense, and		
25	disaster response activities throughout Wisconsin.		

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1	101.2.1.1.	Warning and Communications Officer: The WEM Administrator		
2	appoints a Warning and Communications Officer. The Warning and			
3	Communications Officer is delegated the responsibility for RACES			
4	operations throughout Wisconsin.			
5	101.2.1.2.	Wisconsin RACES Chief Radio Officer (WI CRO): The WI CRO		
6	shall be a	shall be a United States citizen holding a current Federal Communications		
7	Commission (FCC) amateur radio General Class, or higher, license. The WI			
8	CRO is appointed by the WEM Administrator, upon recommendation of the			
9	WEM Comr	nunications and Warning Officer. The WI CRO may serve the		
10	dual role a	s Wisconsin Section Emergency Coordinator.		
11	101.2.1.3.	Wisconsin Deputy RACES Chief Radio Officer (Deputy WI CRO):		
12	The Deput	y WI CRO shall be a United States citizen holding a current FCC		
13	amateur ra	adio General Class, or higher, license. The Deputy WI CRO is		
14	appointed by the WEM Administrator, upon recommendation of the WEM			
15	Communic	ations and Warning Officer and the WI CRO.		
16	101.2.1.4.	County Radio Officers (RO): County ROs are United States		
17	Citizens, h	olding a current FCC amateur radio General Class, or higher,		
18	license. C	ounty ROs are appointed by the county Director of Emergency		
19	Management, subject to the approval of the WI CRO. County ROs may			
20	serve the o	dual role of ARES Emergency Coordinator		
21	101.2.1.5.	Alternate County Radio Officers (ARO): AROs may also be		
22	appointed	in each county by the county Director of Emergency		
23	Manageme	nt, subject to approval by the Wisconsin RACES Chief Radio		
24	Officer. A	ROs, where appointed, are likewise United States citizens		
25	holding a c	current FCC amateur radio General Class, or higher, license.
